

Making Glue From Milk



Serve Information: Makes Fist-Sized Serve Of Milk Glue,

INGREDIENTS:

- 1.5 Cups milk
- 3 Teaspoons white vinegar
- 1 Tablespoon baking soda (plus some spare)

Cup of water (it won't all be used)

1 x 'Prepared earlier' small lunchbox , with glue cooled milk glue in it (details below)

EQUIPMENT:

Medium-sized saucepan

Medium-sized sieve

Mixing bowl

Silicon spatula

Teaspoon

Small lunchbox (with a lid)

Medium-sized paintbrush

Two tissue boxes (full of tissues)



METHOD:

- 1. Heat milk in a saucepan.
- 2. When the milk is warm, add white vinegar.
- 3. Keep heating and stirring the mixture until the solid and liquid parts separate into 'curds and whey'.

 By adding vinegar to heated milk, you create a chemical reaction that makes the milk separate into solid curds and liquid whey. The curds are a milk protein, known as casein. Liquid casein is actually a natural glue.
- 4. Using a sieve, strain the liquid whey into the bowl.
- 5. Then use a spatula to mix the remaining solid lumps of curds into a ball.
- 6. Place the ball of curds back into the saucepan.
- 7. Pour a little bit of water in the saucepan
- 8. Add the baking soda
- 9. Heat the mixture until it starts to bubble.
- 10. The vinegar in the milk glue is acidic. When we add the baking soda, it neutralises the vinegar.

 The bubbles we see when the mixture boils are a result of carbon dioxide gas being given off as part of this chemical reaction.
- 11. Stir the mixture well until it resembles a thick paste. If it looks too thin, add a bit more baking soda. Or if it's too thick, add a bit of extra water.
- 12. Once the consistency of the glue is right, transfer it into a small container with lid
- 13. Set aside glue for at least 15 minutes to cool in the fridge. Take "prepared earlier" Milk Glue from fridge
- 14. Use a paintbrush to add a layer of glue to the bottom of one tissue box. Press the bottom of the other tissue box against it, and push the two tissue boxed together for a few moments.
- 15. Hold the tissue boxes up to see if the glue holds

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

* 1 x 'prepared earlier' serve of milk glue, in a small lunchbox (with a lid): Made as per instructions above, but left to cool.
